Because you've received ANESTHESIA, until the day after your procedure:

NO Strenuous Activity



NO Important Desicion Making

Common side effects of anesthesia that can last 24 hours or longer:



Dizziness



Lightheadedness



Sleepiness



Sore throat after upper endoscopy

Signs of Infection

- Swelling, redness or drainage



Bleeding

Bleeding exceeding 2 tablespoons

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What to Expect After Your Procedure

Be sure to ask your nurse or doctor any questions you may have about caring for yourself after your procedure.



Pair

If you have new or increasing moderate-to-severe pain, contact your doctor or go to the emergency department.



• Nausea or Vomiting

Mild nausea or vomiting may occur after your procedure. However, if you are experiencing extreme nausea or persistent vomiting, please contact your doctor.



Drowsiness

Drowsiness is typical when undergoing a procedure and may persist for 24-48 hours.



Bleeding

If you have new or increasing amounts of bright red bleeding or black/tarry stools, contact your doctor or go to the emergency department. Small amounts of blood on toilet tissue are normal after a colonoscopy.

Please refer to your discharge instructions located within this folder for information on symptoms to watch for after your procedure, instructions about medications and home care.

Common Signs of Infection

- Temperature of 101 degrees
- Chills
- Increased heart rate
- Marked redness/warmth at the IV site

Call Your Doctor

Please contact your doctor if you experience any of these symptoms:

- Persistent nausea or vomiting
- Excessive bleeding

- Uncontrolled pain
- Signs of infection

Call 911 in an Emergency

With any of these symptoms:

- Loss of consciousness
- Difficulty breathing
- Life-or-limb-threatening injury
- Signs of a stroke

At the sign of a heart attack:

- Chest pain
- Pain in the left arm or jaw
- Sudden weakness or dizziness lasting lonter than two minutes
