

Sansum Clinic Urology is Participating in a Study for Overactive Bladder Therapy with the eCoin Device

Sansum Clinic will be one of twenty centers in the United States offering a new treatment for overactive bladder. The eCoin device will be part of an FDA pivotal trial looking at both efficacy and safety.

The electroceutical coin (eCoin) treats urinary urge incontinence, urgency and frequency in women and men. The eCoin is a nickel-sized, pacemaker-like device implanted into the lower leg to stimulate the tibial nerve. This therapy reduces overactive bladder symptoms.

Dr Alexandra Rogers, MD will be implanting the device in patients that qualify for the study over the next few months. The eCoin will potentially eclipse current overactive bladder treatments which include medications, posterior tibial nerve stimulation (i.e. Urgent PC), sacral nerve stimulation (i.e. Interstim) and chemodenervation bladder injections (i.e. Botox). In addition the device is delivered with the convenience of a one-time procedure making it more convenient than Urgent PC and less invasive than both Botox and Interstim.

We are thrilled to deliver the eCoin therapy to our patients with this cutting edge study.
